Jesus Prays for the Disciples
John 17:1–26

<u>Theme:</u> In the climax to John's Farewell Discourse, Jesus turns to the Father in prayer. He prays first that the Father may be glorified through the glorification of the Son. He then prays for His disciples, that they would be protected while in the world. Finally, He prays for the faith, unity and witness of all believers for generations to come.
