One Body, Many Gifts

1 Corinthians 12:12–31 August 2, 2015

Theme: Paul continues his discussion of Spiritual gifts by introducing the metaphor of the body. Just as the human body has many parts that all function together as a unity, so the Body of Christ—the Church—has many individuals with different gifts, all functioning together to accomplish God's purposes. No gifts are independent of others and no gifts are unnecessary.
